The Shire has a very challenging year ahead with a number of major projects for administration to oversee.

The Sport and Recreation Precinct construction tenders are to be advertised in the coming months, with the aquatic centre being the first section of the project. A further community information session is scheduled for Saturday, 19 January 2019 with the Project Management Team and Architects in attendance to answer your questions. The update session will commence at 10am, finishing around 12noon and will be held at the Toodyay Sports Pavilion.

The Shire has been setting aside funds for the replacement of the roof at the Newcastle Goal Museum. Proceeding with this project has been made possible with grant funding received from LotteryWest. With this support we are looking forward to getting this work completed.

The Shire has been successful in gaining Emergency Service Levy (ESL) capital funding from the Department of Fire and Emergency Services for a new fire station for the Coondle Nunile Volunteer Bush Fire Brigade. The tender specification has been prepared in consultation with the brigade, and we look forward to having the project

completed for the 2019/2020 fire season. The new shed will be located near the Coondle Wheat Bin and will provide more space to accommodate larger appliances and will provide better meeting and training facilities. We have also been awarded a grant for the extension of the Morangup Fire Shed, perhaps better described as the Morangup Colocation Centre

Councillors will be preparing and serving breakfast in Duidgee Park on Australia Day - Saturday, 26 January 2019 which will be followed by a Citizenship Ceremony and the announcement of the Community Citizen of the Year Award winners. Awards will be announced in 3 categories: Active Citizenship (Group or Event); Senior Citizen of the Year; and Community Citizen of the Year. Pop on down to Duidgee Park from 7.30 for the free community breakfast.

Shire meetings and dates have changed!! The Shire will now conduct Agenda Briefings on the third Tuesday of each month replacing what was 'Council Forums' which were previously held on the second Tuesday of each month. MAIN ROADS WESTERN AUSTRALIA PROJECT UPDATE JANUARY 2019

Toodyay Road improvements
Shire of Toodyay

Main Roads has now received federal funding and approval to widen a 1.2 km section of road between Racecourse Road and Clackline Toodyay Road in early 2019. Consequently, preconstruction works to prepare for these works will commence soon.

Fencing works are due to commence next week at various sections, which will be followed by removal of vegetation approximately a week after. Works will be ongoing until the end of February 2019. There will be intermittent lane closures and speed restrictions during the vegetation works.

Further Information regarding the expansion of Clackline Nature Reserve and other environmental benefits of the project are available on the Shire's website.

Main Roads understand this is a really busy time with harvest finishing and people

on holidays, but if residents wish to meet to discuss the works, arrangements may be made to meet with Main Roads. Dementia Friendly Communities

TOODYAY – Dementia Friendly Community

Funded by the WA Country Health Service, supported by the Shire of Toodyay, Alzheimer's WA held its community consultation sessions on 11 December 2018 at the Toodyay Community Centre. Toodyay will become one of four Dementia Friendly Communities, alongside Margaret River, Manjimup and York.

In a dementia-friendly community:

- ◆ people are aware of and understand dementia;
- ◆ people with dementia continue to be active participants in their own lives;
- ◆ businesses provide accessible services to people with dementia, including having staff who understand dementia and know how to communicate effectively;
- ◆ employers provide support for people living with the disabilities of dementia to continue with paid employment;
- ◆ the physical environment enables people with dementia to get out and about safely;
- ◆ social groups and organisations are welcoming and inclusive of members with dementia.

With the support of their employer, community, local businesses and organisations, neighbours, friends and family members, people with dementia can continue to do many of the things they did before they received a diagnosis. Increased community awareness about dementia will support people to continue involvement in activities they enjoy, reduce social isolation and add meaning, value and purpose to their day-to-day lives.

With fantastic input provided from our community and local businesses, a working group will now be formed to put an action plan into place for our town.

Mozzies!!!

Mosquitoes can at times impact significantly on the health and lifestyle of residents and visitors to the region.

The Shire is involved in mosquito management on public land, but residents have responsibility for management on their own property and for protecting themselves and their families from mosquito bites.

Of the 100 mosquito species found in WA, only 30 species are considered to be major pests and/or possible carriers of viruses (including, Ross River virus (RRV), Barmah Forest virus (BFV), Murray Valley encephalitis (MVE) virus and West Nile virus Kunjin strain (WNVKUN)) that can cause diseases in humans. For the novice entomologist – the disease carrying mosquitoes (mostly Aedes and Culex species) have white stripes and spotted markings.



What can you do?

Even with our best combined efforts mosquitoes will always be a fact of life in Toodyay. As such, when you are out and about in mosquito prone areas make sure that you wear loose fitting clothes that cover as much of your skin as possible and apply a mosquito repellent, preferably with DEET or Picaridin.

On your property, you can:

- empty any containers on the property that are holding water, ensure to clean and refill pet and animal drinking water containers regularly.
- ensure swimming pools and/ or spas are sufficiently chlorinated and cleaned regularly.
- fit rainwater tanks with insect-proof mesh, including inlet, overflow and inspection ports.
- ensure septic tank vent pipes are fitted with mosquito proof cowls.

Are DEET and Picaridin safe?

All topical insect repellents sold in Australia must be registered with the [Australian Pesticides and Veterinary Medicines Authority](#) (APVMA). The APVMA assess products for their efficacy and safety.

Repellents are considered safe when applied correctly. With extremely widespread use DEET, and increasingly picaridin, (over many years) these have had few reported adverse reactions. As such, the two products have been endorsed by health authorities both here in Australia and internationally as a safest most effective way to avoid mosquito bites. However, if you experience a serious reaction, consult your GP or call the Poison Information Centre Australia on 13 11 26.

What about 'natural' repellents?

Products derived from plants are often perceived to be a more natural alternative to the chemical products such as DEET and picaridin. Homemade concoctions of essential oils, particularly Eucalyptus and Melaleuca oils, are often promoted as the "safe alternative" to commercially available repellents. Unfortunately, several studies have found that essential oils provide only limited protection (see link for peer reviewed journal articles) from biting mosquitoes. Registered commercial products that contain botanical extracts offer some protection but will need to be reapplied far more frequently than even the low concentration DEET- or picaridin-based repellents.

BEEKEEPING REGULATIONS AND FOOD SAFETY

Toodyay has many annual events including the Moondyne Festival, Fibre Festival, Toodyay International Food Festival and Family Fun Day (which coincides with the Avon Descent), and the Toodyay Agricultural Show. Monthly farmers markets within the Shire ensure there is local food for sale that supports our regionally grown produce and, in particular, endorses safe food products for all to enjoy.

Western Australian honey is among the best in the world. Its jarrah honey has excellent anti-microbial properties and similar to that of Manuka honey from New Zealand.



The industry in WA is notable for its freedom from diseases and even exports bees to countries such as Canada each year.

The Western Australian Farmers Federation (Inc) (WAFarmers) represent all our commercial beekeepers in WA. However they recently raised concerns that 'backyard' or 'small lot' honey are not being closely monitored by local governments to ensure that health regulations are being followed. The process of extracting and packing honey needs to comply with the Food Standards Australia New Zealand Food Safety Standards. The WAFarmers further stated that *..we are pleased by the interest and influx of beekeepers to the industry, however we would like to ensure that people selling honey are a registered food business and inspected by local government health officers to ensure they are following the laws and meeting food safety standards and warning/labelling requirements.*

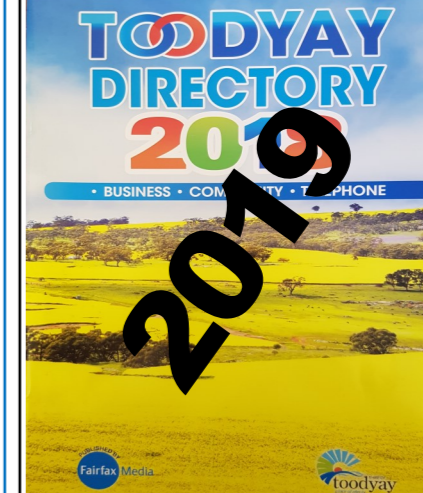
